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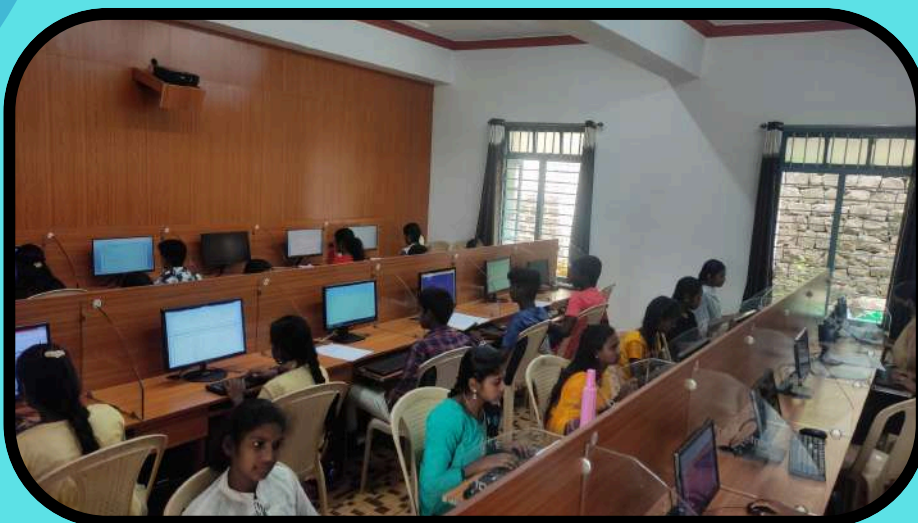
Football Camp 2024

Computer Course 2024

From 09th April to 25th April, The Basic Computer Course for Tribal Children was a collaborative initiative between the SPS India Foundation and the Desai Foundation Trust, aimed at bridging the digital divide and providing essential technological skills to tribal children. The course was conducted with the objective of empowering these young learners with foundational computer knowledge that can enhance their educational and future career opportunities. The course was attended by around 30 tribal children. The selection of participants was based on their interest in developing their knowledge about computers.



Beautician Course 2024

The Beautician Course for Tribal Women, organized by SPS India Foundation in collaboration with Desai Foundation Trust, aimed to provide essential skills in beauty and personal grooming. This initiative was designed to empower tribal women with practical skills that could enhance their self-esteem and open up new livelihood opportunities. There were 30 women participated and benefitted from this course.

Medical Camp 2024

On 30th June 2024, The General Health Check-up Camp held in Maaramangalam Village was a joint initiative by SPS India Foundation and Desai Foundation Trust. The camp aimed to provide comprehensive health check-ups and medical care to the tribal community, focusing on preventive health measures and the early detection of health issues.

There were specialized checkups like Eye checkups to provide essential eye care services and promoting overall eye health. Gynecology health to provide essential health services to tribal women. Pediatric health check to provide essential health services to children who have limited access to medical care, ensuring their overall growth and well-being. The Maramangalam village consist of 100 families and there were 800 were benefitted from this medical camp which rendered service for elderly people, women, and Children.
